Happy New Year to you all — we would like to firstly thank our annual members, corporate members for your recent subscriptions and donations. Our trust and trustees appreciate you all.

Recent grants we have approved:

- Ōtorohanga Museum: Purchased specialist equipment to assist with the preservation of historical documents and photographs. This application was approved for \$3776.60.
- Korakoni School: We contributed towards the refurbishment of the school swimming pool. This application was approved for \$10,000.
- RDA: Have purchased a horse float for the RDA. Application was approved for \$10,965.
- Ōtorohanga Māori Wardens: Application for funding, to support the programs of the Ōtorohanga Māori Wardens. Application was approved for \$5,000.
- Maru Energy Trust: Who continue to work with supporting eligible homeowners within the Ōtorohanga District with your programs. Application approved for \$10,000.
- Maihiihi Playcentre: Is updating their carpentry area at the playcentre. The application was approved for \$2268.
